

UNO and the Algernon Sydney Sullivan Foundation will launch the Sullivan Certificate in Leadership and Entrepreneurship to develop values-driven global changemakers.







The University of New Orleans (UNO) and the <u>Algernon Sydney Sullivan Foundation</u> announce a groundbreaking partnership launching Summer 2026 within the <u>UNO-Innsbruck International Summer School</u>. This collaboration introduces the Sullivan Certificate in Leadership and Entrepreneurship, combining academic study with experiential learning to develop values-driven *changemakers* prepared for global impact.

UNO-Innsbruck International Summer School

Established in 1976, this premier study-abroad program began with 162 students on a chartered Pan Am flight to Austria. Over its nearly 50-year history, it has enrolled more than 10,000 students, becoming one of America's oldest and most respected international education programs.

The immersive six-week summer program features strong academics, international faculty, and vibrant co-curricular experiences spanning historical tours and cultural activities throughout Europe.





Two Legacies of Excellence Unite

The Sullivan Foundation

Founded in 1930, the Algernon Sydney Sullivan Foundation honors the legacy of Algernon and Mary Mildred Sullivan, 19th-century leaders exemplifying service and compassion.

For nearly a century, the Foundation has awarded scholarships and leadership honors at more than 70 colleges across the American South. Through programs like Sullivan Fellows, Ignite Retreats, and Service Corps, the Foundation empowers students to become values-driven changemakers.





The Sullivan Certificate Program: Beginning in Summer 2026, students participating in the UNO-Innsbruck program will have the opportunity to enroll in this specialized track. Upon successful completion of both courses, students will receive the *Sullivan Certificate* in Leadership and Entrepreneurship, recognizing their commitment to creating positive change.

Class 2: Entrepreneurship for Good

A creative, interactive course focusing on social entrepreneurship, venture creation, and innovation for public benefit.

Late Morning Session: Dedicated to collaborative workshops, group projects, and interactive problem-solving sessions.

Application Process

<u>Applications</u> for the summer program will open online in <u>October</u>, with no application fee. Next year's minimum GPA for admission consideration will be 3.0.


Required Documents

Applicants must provide a transcript from their current home university and a <u>Home Campus Information Form (HCIF)</u> The HCIF verifies student notification, policy advisement, and satisfaction of home campus requirements for external study abroad, ensuring grades transfer.

Secure Housing & Amenities

All participants will reside in the modern <u>home4students</u> dorms at Höttinger Au, centrally located in Innsbruck and just a five-minute walk from campus.

- Shared en suite twin rooms with access to shared kitchens.
- 24/7 front desk, keycard access, and program ID requirements ensure resident safety.
- Features include a large groundfloor common area and a dedicated study room.
